We're only barely through the first three months of 2010 and already God is at work in our midst in some very encouraging ways. At least four people have come to know **Jesus Christ as their Savior and Lord**, half a dozen have been baptized, five children have been dedicated to the Lord (and four babies have been born!), we had the opportunity to prepare and send 50,000 meals to Haiti (and sent one of our own to help!)... That's a lot of **great life-change** and is only a fraction of the stories of what God has been doing in our midst! We don't share these things to boast of what we are doing (we can do nothing without Him, after all), but rather to rejoice in God's work among His people - for His glory. Our prayer is that God would continue to work in our hearts - that His Holy Spirit would continue to convict us of our sin and

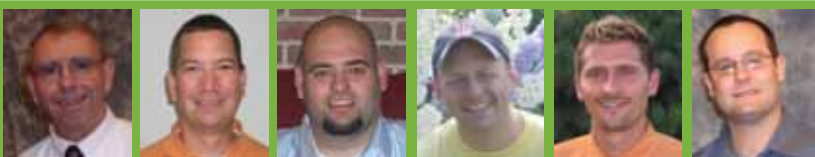
God has also led us to a significant ministry change in these first three months when we formally **adopted Grace Bible Church** of Aurora in February and became a church that meets in two different locations. On April 11, we'll also be voting on the adoption of the other church we have been partnering with over these past 12 months, the First Baptist Church of Shabbona. We're excited about these opportunities - not because we like change for the sake of change - but first, because God has called us to it, and second, because He has shown us that together we can make an even greater impact on the **His Kingdom**. That's exciting.

In this ministry update you will see a major focus on our **short term mission projects** for 2010. If you haven't already begun to seek God's direction for your own life in regards to these possible trips, we would encourage you do so... Caring for orphans in **China**, helping with a Bible Camp in **Alaska**, sharing God's love in **Uganda** - or reaching out to our neighbors through projects in **Chicago, Aurora and Shabbona**... There are plenty of ways to step out of your day to day environment and **serve God** in a new way this year. Would you join us in prayer about that possibility!?!

Repent of your sins. Acts 3:19: *Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord.*

Receive Jesus as your Savior. John 3:16: *For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.*


Rejoice with other believers in your salvation. Hebrews 10:25: *Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the day approaching.*

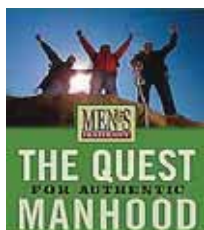

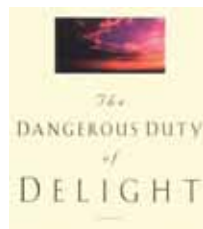

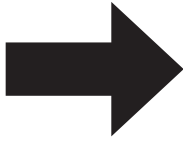

MISSIONS: SHORT-TERM TRIPS



JUNE 4-14

We will be teaming with **Visiting Orphans**, established by America World Adoption Association as a way to further help the orphans of the world. Visiting Orphans works to fulfill the biblical mandate given in James 1:27 of “visiting orphans” in their distress. They conduct mission trips to orphanages around the world and work with churches to raise awareness in the hopes of each child experiencing the blessing of having a family through: reunification, transitional services and adoption.

Visiting Orphans is also the organization that we partnered with in January for our mission trip to Haiti.

For our trip to China, we will work with a government run Social Welfare Institute (SWI) to help bring love and assistance to some of those **20 million children** without families. Our purpose will be **to serve and to love children in need**. This will include spending time **holding babies** and **playing with children**, doing crafts and service projects for the orphanage, but we will also have the opportunity to **teach Bible lessons** through translators.

We will also have the opportunity to explore Beijing for the final two days of our trip before we head back to the USA.

JUNE 18-29

We will be seeing much of God's beautiful country as we fly into **Anchorage, Alaska**. We will then charter several smaller 6 to 10 seat "puddle-jumpers" to travel the last 200 miles southwest to the village of **Port Alsworth**, a small town on Lake Clark where there are no roads. **Tanalian Bible Camp** primarily reaches out to the native people who live in the villages surrounding this area, again, where there are no roads. Nearly all of the students who attend this camp will need to be **flown in as part of the outreach**.

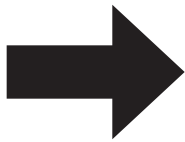
Our own missionaries, **James & Sharon Walsh**, have been running Tanalian Bible Camp for nearly 19 years, and we're excited to be heading back for our fourth consecutive summer to **serve the Lord** at TBC!

We will work with the Primary Camp this summer, which is the 3rd and 4th grade camp. You can choose to be a counselor, work in the kitchen, or do camp maintenance. It's a blessing getting to help these children **memorize Bible verses**, learn practical **outdoor skills**, play games, and show them **Christ's love!** It's a cross-cultural experience in our own country, and all ministry is done in English!

We always look forward to trips where we visit and encourage missionaries supported by our church. We are looking forward to partnering with **Matt & Crystal Kehn** and helping with their ministry in Uganda. They work with an organization called “**Juna Amagara**” which means “**Saving Lives**,” which they try to do both physically and spiritually.

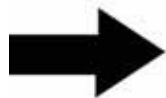
One of our focuses will be helping Matt with the **ABIDE** program he established, which is an intensive discipleship program for students who have just finished high school for the year before they head off to Bible school, university, or a trade. Those who are able will help with the mentoring and teaching.

Secondly, some on the team will assist Crystal, who will be 8 months pregnant. She will need lots of help with her ministry at the local orphanage and **day-to-day life** with her young boys, as she’s getting ready for the baby to come. We’ll help with **service projects** at the orphanage and spend time **showing love** to the orphans.

Young people in Uganda love to play sports, especially soccer, which has proved to be an in-road for the gospel. So, for those who are able, we’ll be teaming with another group doing **sports ministry outreaches** with the children on the weekends.

LIBRARY UPDATES

Girls who dream of princesses and boys who aspire to be a hero will gain valuable insight as they learn, along with the young **princess and squire**, the value of their purity, what it means to face the dangers of temptation, and what it takes to guard one's heart from all that is impure.



The American Adventure books are about everyday life during important events our country's history, from the crossing of the Mayflower to the end of World War II. FINANCIAL UPDATE

We each make up a part of the Village Bible Church family - a family that God has created.

He is using us to encourage and sharpen each other as we strive to serve Him with our lives. He is also using us to reach others in our communities and around the world with the very good news of the Gospel.

We are grateful for God's financial provisions that have sustained our ministries and trust Him to provide for the new initiatives He has placed before us.

This year, we have broken the cost for new initiatives into three groupings, hoping to tackle them one by one as contributions support their costs.



The first goal is to extend our support for existing missionaries and to send some new ones out into the field. (Turn to the next page for info on the Nickels and Reesers who are heading out in April!) We're deferring the other two sets of initiatives until contributions grow closer to meeting those needs.

Here's where we're at as of the end of March:

Baseline Financial Needs + Missions Commitments = \$76,000 per month
Giving through March 2010: = \$70,000 per month
Year-To-Date Shortage: \$19,500 (\$6,500/month)

2010 Initiatives: This year we have split our growth initiatives into groups - hoping to accomplish them all in 2010, but striving to tackle them one at a time. In order to meet the financial components of these initiatives, our monthly offerings need to grow as follows:

Initiatives Deferred until contributions increase:

2010 Ministry Initiatives: + \$2,500 per month (*Deferred*)

2010 Staff Initiatives: + \$3,500 per month (*Deferred*)

MISSIONARIES OF THE MONTH

Phil and Sarah Nickels are getting ready to go to **Tanzania**. They are planning on leaving on **April 18th** and we are planning on officially sending them off as a **church family on April 11th**. The Nickels family is excited to see what God will do through their ministry with the **Rafiki Foundation**, which is a Christian organization whose goal is to help Africa's orphaned and vulnerable children become godly contributors to their communities and the world. It was established in 1985 by Rosemary Jensen and others who desired to help the **children of Africa**. Rafiki's plan for Africa has the potential of impacting thousands of children through the establishment of Rafiki Training Villages and Rafiki Satellite Villages. Rafiki Foundation provides God's Word and ministries of mercy to children in ten African countries.



Rafiki Villages provide living and educational facilities in African countries where there are many orphans. The vision of the Rafiki Village is to support the community by operating a home environment and quality schools for orphans, and quarterly medical care for community residents. Rafiki Villages provide a Christian environment for young men and women to develop leadership and life skills that promote their physical and spiritual well-being.

Chad and Julie Reeser have raised 100% of their support and are excited to leave for **Spain!** At this point they are patiently awaiting their visas - once they have those they will purchase their plane tickets. Chad and Julie anticipate developing **discipleship ministries** in Madrid, Spain. Specifically, Chad plans to be a catalyst for

effective discipleship in the local church by strengthening **theological education** in Spain. Julie plans to serve through hospitality, small groups and one-on-one discipleship. Pray that **God gives them wisdom** and guidance as they settle in another country, especially as they choose a home church in Spain because that will serve as their "internship" for a short time while they learn the language and adjust to the culture.
